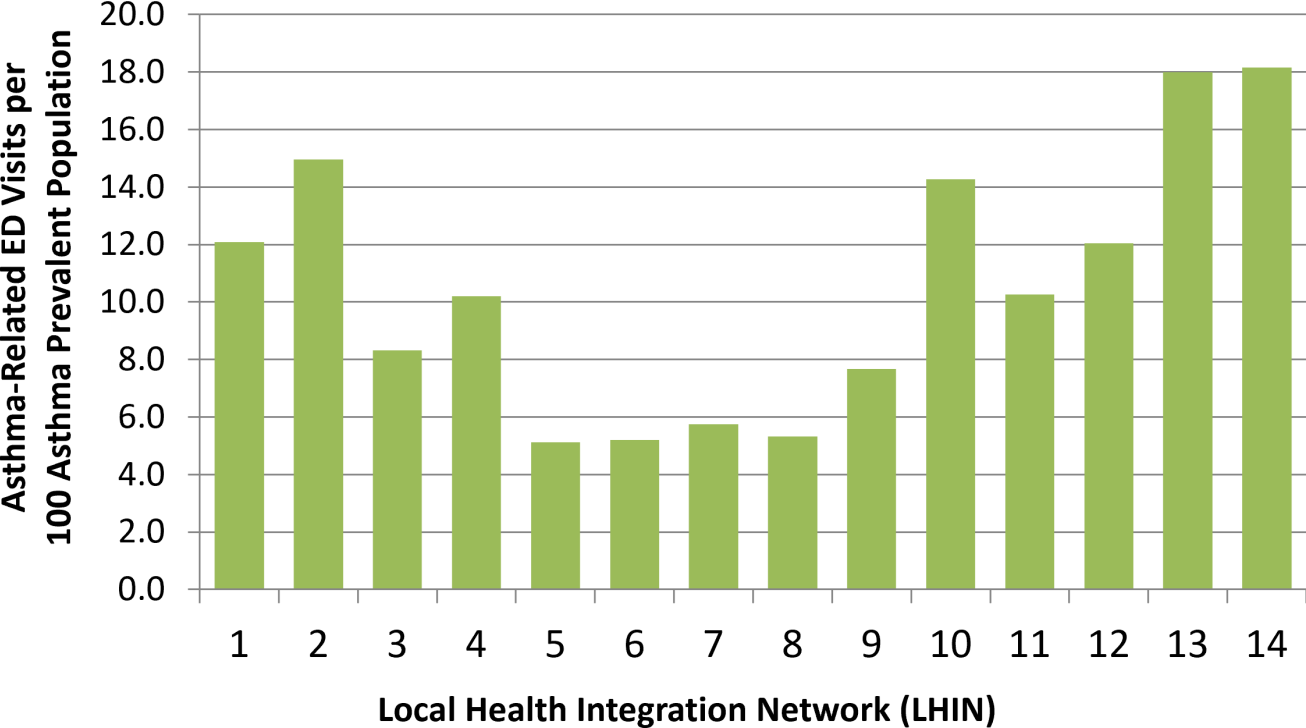

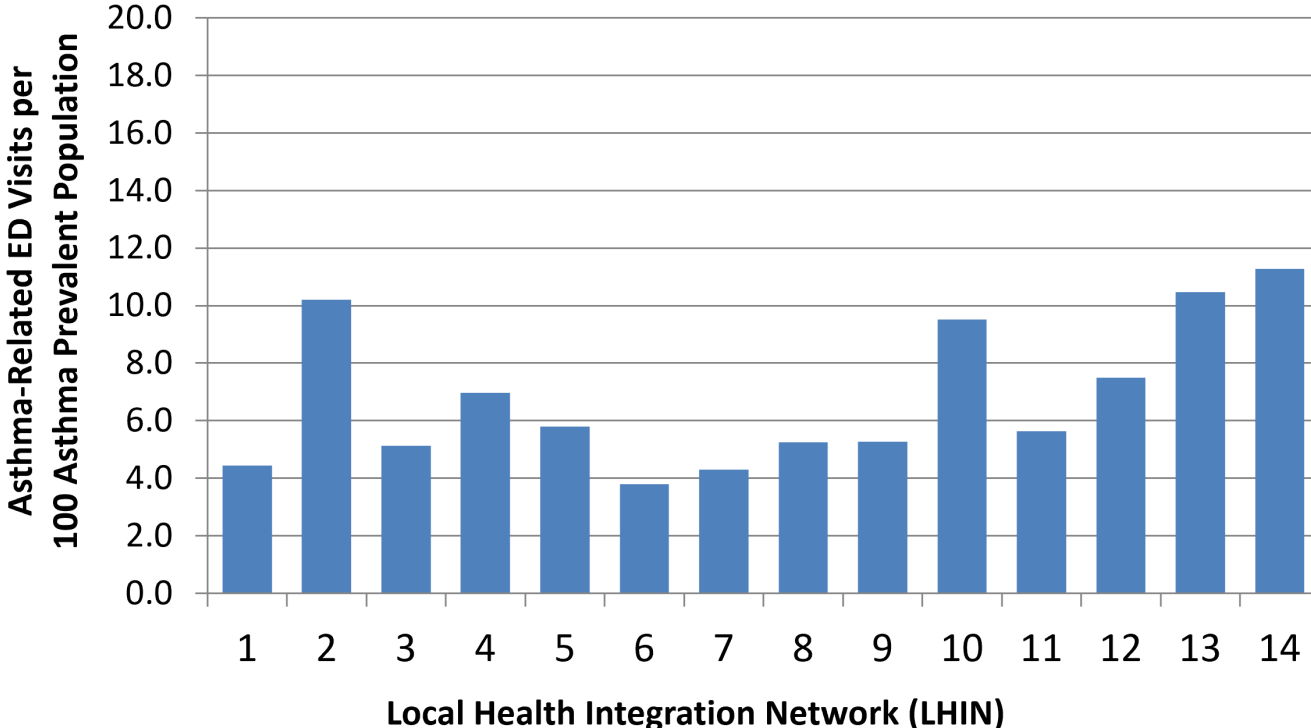

**Asthma-related conditions** include acute respiratory infections, other diseases of the upper respiratory tract, pneumonia and influenza, COPD and allied conditions, other diseases of lung or respiratory system, atopic dermatitis and related conditions, and symptoms involving respiratory system and other chest symptoms. In adults, asthma-related conditions also include gastro-esophageal reflux disorder, heartburn, and allergic contact dermatitis.
