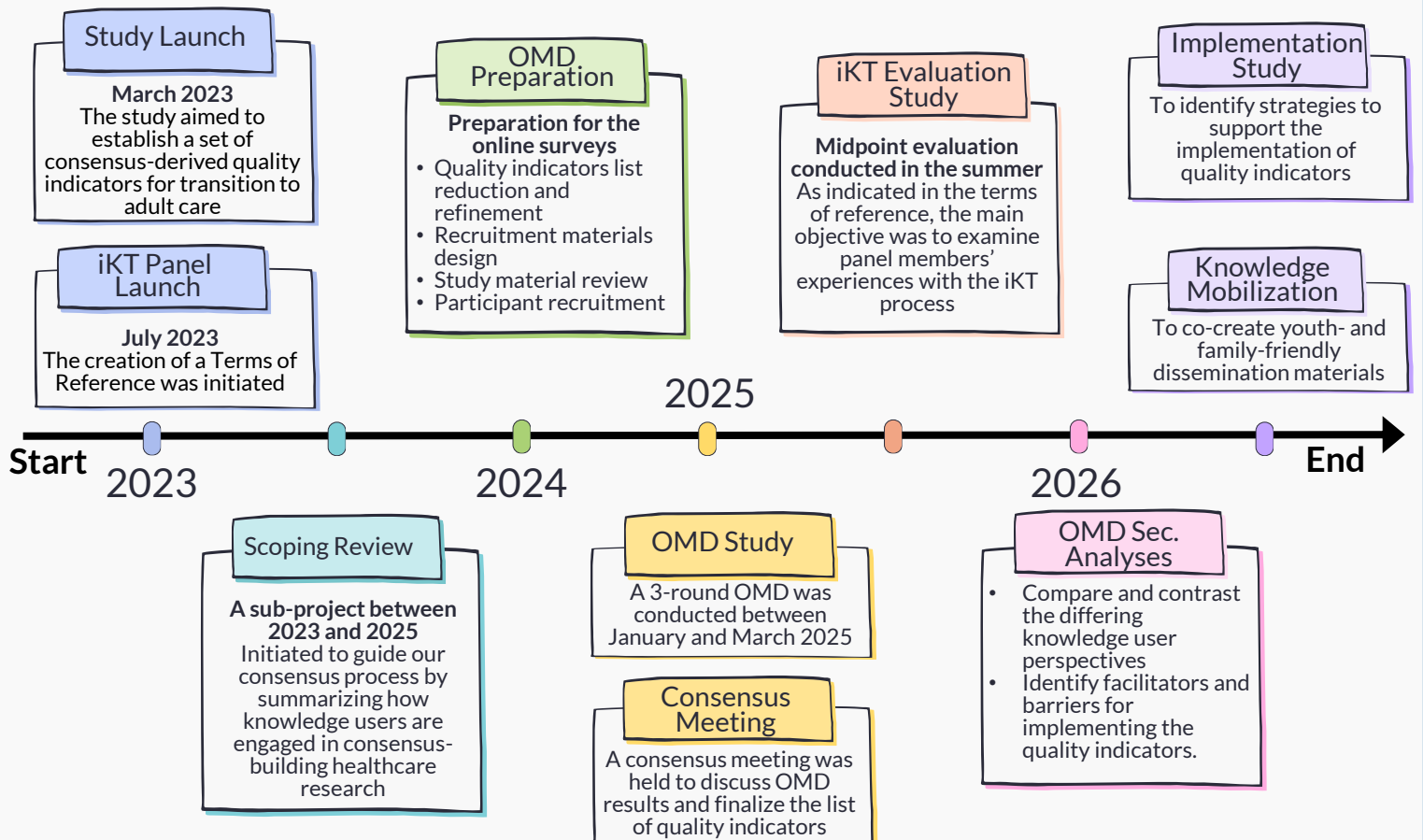
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## Welcome to the 6th edition of our newsletter!

# Quality Indicators for Transition from Paediatric to Adult Care

## **Manuscripts in the Works:**

- **Manuscript 1:** Online modified Delphi (OMD) and consensus meeting results submitted to *Pediatrics*
- **Manuscript 2:** Describe and critically reflect on the strategies used to support equitable, multi-knowledge user consensus study – *in progress*

## **OMD Secondary Analyses:**

- **Qualitative content analyses comparing the differing perspectives** of the transition process from youth, caregivers, healthcare providers and health decision makers- *in progress*

## **Implementation Study:**

This study will focus on identifying barriers and facilitators that may impact the implementation of the quality indicators and linking these determinants to evidence-based strategies

- **Phase 1:** Secondary data content analysis from the OMD study was completed to inform subsequent qualitative interviews – *completed*
- **Phase 2:** Qualitative interviews will be conducted with key knowledge users across various settings – *expected start date summer 2026*

## Scoping review on patient, caregiver and knowledge user engagement in consensus-building healthcare initiatives

### **Manuscript:**

- The manuscript was submitted in November 2025 to the *Journal of Clinical Epidemiology* and is under review

## Integrated Knowledge Translation (iKT) Evaluation Study

### **Mid-point iKT evaluation study:**

- In summer 2025, we interviewed the iKT panel to explore their engagement experiences
- Analysis has been completed, and findings were discussed with the iKT panel
- A manuscript will be submitted to *Health Expectations* this spring
